The prompt given below has several different parts and we ask that you address as many of them as possible or as you feel is necessary. The order in which you address the topics is of no importance. The format for the essay is not set, therefore you may write the essay in whatever manner you see fit. However, we do ask that the essay is a minimum of 500 words. Your essay will be scored on several different aspects, but focusing mainly on your insight and thought put forth in addressing the topic given to you, also taking into account your spelling, grammar, punctuation etc. We ask that the essay be typed; you may email PDF versions of your essay to tyler@friendlypines.com. We look forward to reading your essay and learning a little more why you should become part of our CILT program. Good luck!

In the past few years, Friendly Pines Camp has put forth a greater effort in the understanding and reduction of bullying and other anti-social behavior. - *Why do you think kids/adults bully one another?*
- *How do you feel you would deal with bullying now, being a CILT, as opposed to dealing with it as a camper?*
- *How do you hope to contribute, as a CILT, to the bullying solution?*
